THE WORLD OF NANCY KWAN - A Salute to Nancy Kwan

Program includes a Film Clip Compilation + On-Stage Conversation + Book Signing

Wednesday, April 23 7:30pm

When **Nancy Kwan** burst onto the scene in the early 1960s, Asian characters in film were portrayed by white actors in makeup playing "yellowface," and those minor roles were the stuff of cliché: shopkeepers, maids, prostitutes, servants. When -- against all odds -- Nancy landed the lead role in the muchanticipated 1960 film *The World of Suzie Wong*, she became an international superstar and was celebrated for her beauty, grace, authenticity, and spunk: a "Chinese Garbo," the "Asian Bardot." From Hong Kong to London, Hollywood and beyond, "The World of Nancy Kwan" charts Nancy's journey as a luminary and pinnacle of representation in Hollywood. What obstacles did she face, what prejudices did she overcome, and how did her success create paths for others? Never allowing the fads and fickleness of show business to change her, Kwan persevered in an industry where everything was stacked against her, breaking through barriers and becoming a beacon of hope to generations of Asians who aspired to be seen. "The World of Nancy Kwan" is

a multifaceted personal history of an iconic actress whose triumphant rise and resilience illuminates the broader history of Hollywood and how the only way forward is to stay true to oneself. The program will feature a film clip compilation program of Ms. Kwan's television and film roles (to date) followed by an on-stage conversation hosted by Author and Film Historian Foster Hirsch, followed by a book signing.

HUNT FOR THE OLDEST DNA

Wednesday, April 23 7:00pm

Hunt for the Oldest DNA tells the story of a maverick gene hunter, whose single-minded pursuit of an improbable scientific vision would tease and torment him before ending with a stunning triumph: a lost world recovered from a spoonful of dirt. Two decades ago, Eske Willerslev had a radical idea: Could DNA, the fragile chemical code of life, survive intact in frozen sediment for millennia? Fellow scientists called him crazy. But the Danish biologist set out to prove everybody wrong, and his perseverance paid off with a landmark breakthrough -- with massive implications for how we understand the deep past. After many years of failure, Willerslev recovered the genetic traces of a lush forest ecosystem from before the Ice Age, more than two million years ago. The species identified from their DNA lived during the last hot epoch on Earth. Signaling a new era in DNA research, scientists can now use DNA to travel back millions of years and piece together vanished ecosystems. Today, they are poised to harvest the genetic secrets of these



Wednesday, April 23 6:30pm



Salute to Jon Avnet

With one of the most impressive, versatile and accomplished resumes in Hollywood, **Jon Avnet** has directed, written, and produced more than 80 motion pictures, television movies, series and Broadway plays, winning Oscars, Emmys, Tonys, Peabody's, DGA Awards, the Humanitas, Golden Globes, and the AFI's Franklin Shaffner Medal, among others. Audiences know him best for co-writing, directing and producing the beloved film *Fried Green Tomatoes* -- which garnered multiple Academy Award nominations, BAFTAs, and a nomination for Best Picture by the Golden Globes -- in addition to the feature films *Uprising*, *Three Christs*, and *Between Two Women*. Other notable directing credits include *Up Close and Personal* and *Righteous Kill* and episodes of "Justified," "Manhunt: Deadly Games," "Sneaky Pete," "Boomtown," "Justified City Primeval," and "The Starter Wife." In addition to his wide success as a director, Avnet has produced several critically acclaimed films including Paul Brickman's *Risky Business* and *Men Don't Leave*, *Black Swan*, *The Burning Bed*, Less *Than Zero*, *Red Corner*, *When a Man Loves a Woman*, *Mama Flora's Family*, *Heatwave* in addition to the popular films *The Mighty Ducks* trilogy, *The Three Musketeers*, *Inspector Gadget*, and *George of the Jungle*.



His upcoming film projects include a documentary about American Ballet Theater's principal ballerina, Isabella Boylston (which he is directing and producing with Jennifer Garner), a film based on a script by Washington Post journalist and Pulitzer Prize winner Eli Saslow (which he is directing), *The Secret Life of the Lonely Doll*, and he is also working as a producer with Graham Yost on his first film as a director. Avnet is the CEO of Indigenous Media (IM), which he founded with Rodrigo Garcia and his son Jacob Avnet. IM produces "60 Second Docs," which has received over 10 billion views and has more than 12.3 million followers. On Broadway, Avnet's plays have received 35 Tony nominations and 12 Tony awards. He produced two Tony Award-winning shows, "Spamalot" and "The History Boys," (with Bill Haber) along with "The Pillowman," "Inherit the Wind," "The Seafarer," and "Country Girl." In addition to his film, television and stage work, Avnet has participated as a mentor at the Director's Lab at Sundance and its sister program in France. He lectures on film and Holocaust studies at numerous universities worldwide and has supported a diverse range of charitable organizations. His humanitarian work has taken him around the world to interview historical figures including Nelson Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Oliver Tambo, Thabo Mbeki, Cyril Ramaphosa in addition to over 200 Holocaust survivors. Today, Avnet is Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors at AFI, where he has been a guiding force for over 30 years (and Chairman for 8 years). He was twice chair of the Directors Guild of America Negotiations committee, making unprecedented gains for all Guild members -- including the first AI protections for any Union in the U.S. which eventually led to the formation of the DGA AI Committee (chaired by Christopher Nolan and Avnet). He serves on the Board of Directors, the Western Directors Council, and the Pension and Health Plan Committee of the DGA. In addition, Avnet has served on the Board of Advisors for the School of Arts

ON SWIFT HORSES

Muriel (Daisy Edgar-Jones) and her husband Lee (Will Poulter) are beginning a bright new life in California when he returns from the Korean War. But their newfound stability is upended by the arrival of Lee's charismatic brother, Julius (Jacob Elordi), a wayward gambler with a secret past. A dangerous love triangle quickly forms. When Julius takes off in search of the young card cheat he's fallen for (Diego Calva), Muriel's longing for something more propels her into a secret life of her own, gambling on racehorses and exploring a love she never dreamed possible. Directed by Daniel Minahan, with a screenplay by Bryce Kass, based on the novel of the same name by Shannon Pufahl, *On Swift Horses* also stars Sasha Calle, Kat Cunning and Don Swayze. UNBROKEN

The feature film UNBROKEN will be preceded by the short film WATCHING WALTER

Thursday, April 24 7:00pm

The daughter of a Holocaust survivor, filmmaker Beth Lane, embarks on an international quest to uncover answers about the plight of her mother and six siblings who escaped Nazi Germany. The powerful documentary chronicles the seven Weber siblings who evaded certain capture and death, and ultimately escaped Nazi Germany following their mother's incarceration and murder at Auschwitz. After being hidden in a laundry hut by a benevolent farmer, the children spent two years on their own in war torn Germany. Emboldened by their father's mandate that they 'always stay together,' the children used their own cunning and instincts to fight through hunger, loneliness, rape, bombings and fear. Their journey culminates with a painful ultimatum, when, separated from their father, they are told that they must declare themselves as orphans in order to escape to a new life in America. Unbeknownst to them, this salvation would become what would finally tear them apart, not to be reunited for another 40 years. *UnBroken* is Beth Lane's feature debut, written by Lane and Aaron Soffin. *Presented with our friends at 3 Stars Jewish Cinema*. 96mins. Set in both 1995 Philadelphia and World War II Nazi occupied Poland, and based on the true story of Holocaust survivor-turned watchmaker Wladyslaw "Walter" Wojnas, WATCHING WALTER is a slice of life story that touches on several poignant moments in Wojnas life during those times. It's a story of triumph over tragedy and is all too relevant in today's turbulent international climate. Beth Lane is the award-winning director, executive producer and writer of the feature documentary film UNBROKEN. An actress, singer and dancer, she is a second-generation Holocaust survivor. Beth's driving force has always been to create spaces to exercise our collective capacity for empathy through storytelling, design

and meditation. Building bridges for a better future is paramount to her work. A keynote speaker, she has curated and served on panels nationwide & hosted over 40 episodes of a weekly Instagram Live on-camera podcast, "Banter with Beth." Beth is the founder of The Weber Family Arts Foundation which is the culmination of many thoughtful years of experience as an artist and activist serving on philanthropic boards and volunteering. The mission of WFAF is to combat antisemitism, bigotry and hate by driving awareness, engagement and activism through the arts, across a wide variety of mediums, by sharing stories of hope. *UnBroken* is The Weber Family Arts Foundation's inaugural project. de Lamarondiere Rock Productions is a subsidiary of WFAF.



Stephen Tobolowsky has appeared in over 250 movies and television shows. He is best known for roles in *Groundhog Day, Memento*, "Silicon Valley," "Californication," "Glee," "The Goldbergs," and Norman Lear's new "One Day at a Time." He co-wrote *True Stories* with David Byrne and Beth Henley. He wrote and performed *Stephen Tobolowsky's Birthday*

Party, which premiered at the HBO Comedy Festival, and his concert film *The Primary Instinct* (which screened at USAFF in 2018). Stories from his notable podcast "The Tobolowsky Files" have been heard across the country on NPR and PRI radio stations, and can be heard anytime on Slashfilm.com and on iTunes. His books of short stories, "The Dangerous Animals Club" and "My Adventures with God," are published by Simon and Schuster.



Mark Dylan Brown is an award-winning writer for film, television, and theater. Originally from Philadelphia, PA, Mark's character-driven, socially relevant scripts and plays have placed in numerous competitions and festivals all across the U.S. He attended UCLA's School of Theater, Film & Television. He is a current

member of the VS. Theater Company, Station House Reading Series, and Detroit Street Films, located in Los Angeles.



Mitch Yapko is an award-winning director/ writer/producer, known for his unique character work, focusing often on real characters in surreal situations. His films have shown in over 150 film festivals over the years. Mitch has spent over 15 years directing shorts and pilots, sketch comedies and

web series. With a background in theater performance, he has the unique ability to connect with his actors to bring out the best performances every time. When he's not directing narrative content, Mitch produces commercials and photo shoots for brands such as adidas, Nike, Jack Daniels, XBOX, Footlocker, Taco Bell, Converse and more.



Upon graduating from The American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York City, **Cynthia Gravinese-Brown** began working in Off-Broadway and regional theatres. As a writer, executive producer, and actress, her love for dance inspired her to develop "Meet

Me at the Barre," an award-winning streaming web series. Next, Cynthia will appear in the feature films *Something's More Than One Thing* and the psychological thriller *Protos*. She recently produced WATCHING WALTER, with her husband Mark, and the film *Baby Blues* - both playing at festivals across the country.

Set against the rich cultural backdrop of 1960s Lima, Ricardo de Montreuil's compelling drama tells the story of Norma Piet, a woman in her mid-30s whose life is upended when her husband abruptly abandons her. Left to face the scorn of high society and the burden of personal betrayal, Norma's world collapses as she grapples with isolation and self-doubt. However, her story takes an unexpected turn when she embarks on a journey of self-discovery through the vibrant and diverse world of Peruvian cuisine as she forges an unlikely friendship with the family's chauffeur, Oscar. As they explore Peru's culinary heritage together, Oscar helps Norma rediscover her identity and appreciate the beauty in the country's diversity. Join us for a collection of comedic and dramatic short films. In André Hayato Saito's AMARELA a Japanese-Brazilian teenager who rejects her family traditions experiences a violence that seems invisible; in Faek Falak's HIGH SPIRITS five friends and colleagues experience a turbulent night that tests their friendship and changes their lives; in Sebastian Kwidziński's MOTHER a woman on parole returns to her hometown to meet her 11-year-old son; in Anissa Daoud's MRS. FAIZA & DR. LOVE a mother pursues a career that allows her to reconnect with her youthful ambitions and to be unafraid of transgression; and in Sue Ann Pien's ONCE MORE, LIKE RAIN MAN experience a day in the life of an autistic actress who runs the gambit of stereotypes she has to deal with in a funny, frustrating, painful and sometimes triumphantly sarcastic kind of way. 98mins.

SHARP CORNER

Friday, April 25 7:00pm

Based on the short story from Russell Wangersky's Giller Prizenominated collection "Whirl Away," *Sharp Corner* is the story of a man's spiral as he tries to find greater purpose in his life. Josh (Ben Foster), a hapless family man, and his wife, Rachel (Cobie Smulders), escape the city for an idyllic country home — the perfect setting to raise their six-year-old son, Max (Will Kosovic). But on their first night, a fatal car accident on the sharp corner in front of the house disrupts their plans, and Josh finds himself drawn into saving the lives of the car crash victims. As his obsession takes hold, he places his wife and son in jeopardy, setting in motion a series of events that threaten to break his family apart. Writer/director Jason Buxton's gripping film is not only a psychological thriller but a dark satire that subtly critiques the fragile nature of contemporary masculinity. 110mins.

Join us for a program of dramatic and wildly creative new U.S. and international student works including Jason Adam Maselle's PUNTER which follows a young boy who must navigate the underbelly of the gambling world for his father; in So Man Tsoi's MINT CONDITION a primary school student risks being modified into a robot if she fails to perform to perfection; in Linus von Stumberg's SYNCOPE a dance ensemble must dance for their lives; in Max Tullio's ALL BEAUTY QUEENS HAVE BROKEN BONES a young girl believes God has told her she must break her leg (literally) to win the Miss Teen Indiana Pageant; in Zhihao (Dino) Zheng's AMPHIBIAN a downtrodden man becomes an axolotl; and in Alexis Bouillé's outrageous SHAOLIN OFFICE an over-loaded employee working late faces-off with the cleaner who gets in the way. 93mins.



HANCOCK PARK

Fifty-something Ruby Lewis (Christina Beck) is an aging actress who has spent years taking care of her dying father, an alcoholic who earned his living playing cowboys in Hollywood Westerns. Forced to sell the family's palatial Pasadena home, Ruby puts on her fraying designer gown and straps on her gold heels. Into her Louis Vuitton knockoff duffle bag, she packs a stack of legal documents, her father's favorite boots, and a box from the crematorium. After a fruitless audition for a role she is wrong for, Ruby arrives in Hancock Park for an extended stay with her younger sister, Sara, and Sara's injured stuntman husband, Andy. Hotheaded Andy is sure Ruby is withholding their father's fortune from Sara, while Sara tries her best to stay sober and keep everyone happy. Sara introduces her sister to the downstairs neighbor, Jason, a permanently high, eye-patch-wearing, Telsa-driving, reiki-certified massage therapist, who takes a shine to Ruby. While refusing to admit she's on the brink of homelessness, Ruby's theatrical presence and blatant lies quickly cause problems for everyone in the Hancock Park apartment complex. In survival mode, Ruby goes to extremes as she plays the role of her lifetime, weaving a tale of woe while she's secretly sly as a fox. 84mins. In attendance: writer/director Christina Beck.



WHATEVER IT TAKES

In the summer of 2019, a seemingly ordinary couple became the unsuspecting victims of a campaign of cyberstalking that spiraled out of control. Their quiet lives were shattered by sinister threats, grotesque deliveries -- such as a bloody pig mask -- and mounting paranoia. As the terror escalated, law enforcement, including the FBI, traced the trail back to an unthinkable source: eBay, the global giant famed for its motto that "people are basically good." What they uncovered was a surreal tale of power, obsession, and desperation, driven by senior members of the company's security team, who were attempting to protect their CEO from a feared corporate raider. Jenny Carchman's jaw-dropping documentary dives into this extraordinary true crime story, exploring the disintegration of corporate ethics, the unchecked dysfunction at the heart of a tech empire, and the lives of a journalist couple forever changed by their ordeal. LOVE, DANIELLE

Saturday, April 26 4:00pm

When Danielle (Devin Sidell), a happily married thirty-something, tests positive for a BRCA1 gene mutation she learns that this puts her at high risk for developing breast and ovarian cancer. Thanks a lot, DNA! She now struggles with daily life, working at her bakery with her hubby Pat (Michael Roark) and hanging out with slightly clueless best buds on game night (Marianna Palka & lan Owens), while supporting her older, smart-alecky sister Amy (Jaime King) who is already undergoing chemotherapy for a breast cancer diagnosis. Danielle now contemplates preemptively removing her "ticking time bomb" breasts and reproductive organs before cancer can get her, too. Her decision-making process involves flashbacks of her screwed up childhood with absent parents, anesthesia-induced dreams, and stressful confrontations with her recovering alcoholic mother (Lesley Ann Warren) and self-absorbed 70's western TV star father (Barry Bostwick). Ultimately, Danielle must figure out how to prioritize her health and well-being by putting herself first in this scorchingly intimate and humor-filled triumph. Directed by Marianna Palka, and co-written by Steven Sears and Devin Sidell, based on Sidell's real life experiences. 79mins. Filmmakers in attendance.



REBEL WITH A CLAUSE

One fall day in 2018, Ellen Jovin set up a folding table on a Manhattan sidewalk with a homemade sign that said "Grammar Table." Right away, passersby began excitedly asking questions, telling stories, and filing complaints. What happened next is the stuff of grammar legend. Ellen and her filmmaker husband, Brandt Johnson, took the table on the road, visiting all 50 states as Brandt shot the grammar action. But this story transcends grammar. It's the story of an epic quest in a divided time to bring us all closer together. 85mins. In Attendance: director/producer/cinematographer/editor Brandt Johnson and film subject/author Ellen Jovin



Brandt Johnson is the producer, director, cinematographer, and editor of the docucomedy Rebel with a Clause -- and he is married to the film's subject, Ellen Jovin. Before this project, he wrote and produced several plays and a comedy web series.
